

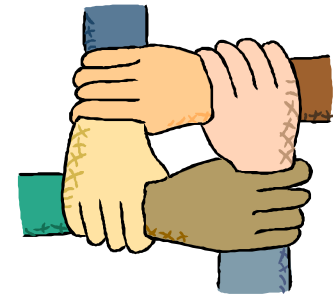

As an outgrowth of the People's Resource Center's Job Assistance Team, and in association with the Chicago Jobs Council, the WSJC coalition was launched in May of 2007. Members meet bi-monthly as a General Assembly and as three task force groups, including *Client Needs*, *Training & Development*, and *Public Policy/Advocacy* to focus on current issues and initiatives.
