Accomplishments 2013

1. Received second grant from the DuPage Community Foundation to continue Care for Cars program which has served over 160 low income job seekers and workers in DuPage County to obtain and retain employment
2. Retained 30 out of 32 member agencies and added 4 new member agencies (Goodwill, Care for Cars, Leading to Action, and DuPage Workforce Board).
3. Received membership dues from all member agencies by the end of the second quarter.
4. Maintained consistent attendance of approximately 22-28 members for each general meeting.
5. Represented WSJC at the Chicago Jobs Council and as member of 21st Century Workforce Development Fund, a governor appointed statewide task force, to identify potential interventions for low income/disadvantaged job seekers and the working poor
6. Changed e-mail server to Microsoft Outlook to provide more professional communication to members,
7. Revamped website to create more current updates of WSJC activities and information
8. Changed By-Laws to ensure oversight of expenditures for Treasurer.

Goals 2014

1. Continue strong member recruitment and retention activities to increase scope of agencies and ensure representation for diverse low income job seeker populations.
2. Hold an appreciation event for committee members in first quarter and an employer breakfast in November as part of the Annual Meeting
