

We are excited to share the news that Governor Rauner has decided to request a statewide waiver of the SNAP time limit for 2017. This will protect SNAP benefits for over 200,000 men and women and provide time for the State to responsibly implement the time limit when Illinois no longer qualifies for a statewide waiver.
