Employer Survey: Suspended Licenses

Building Trans Competency in the Work Place

According to a thorough [survey](#) documenting poverty and unemployment within the transgender community, trans people are twice as likely to be living in poverty compared to the general population and three times more likely to be unemployed. Chicago House's TransWorks Program offers trainings at local businesses and social service agencies to help create processes and environments that are trans inclusive and affirming. Each training is designed to help staff understand legal protections for transgender employees, identify and interrupt transphobia in the workplace and in programming, and communicate respectfully with transgender colleagues and clients. TransWorks cover topics such as terminology 101 and how to make the workplace safer and more accessible for TGNC (trans and gender non conforming) consumers and employees. TransWorks is a no cost program available to anyone who identifies as gender non-conforming, trans, or other.
