Opportunity Works Cohort Openings

Opportunity Works is a paid internship program for opportunity youth (young adults who are not in school and not connected to employment) in suburban Cook County. The program aims to connect young adults to career

pathways in high-demand, high-growth industries. The paid internships expose young adults to viable family-sustaining careers, expand their skill sets, and connect them to the training and resources they need to achieve long-term employment in sectors such as Manufacturing; Information Technology; Healthcare; Construction; and Transportation, Distribution, and Logistics. 
