Digital Equity Capacity Kickstarter Grant

Funding

The Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) for the <u>Digital Equity Capacity</u> <u>Kickstart (DECK) program</u> is available. The DECK program provides an opportunity for community-based organizations, nonprofits, political subdivisions, public libraries, and public schools to apply for **up to \$50,000 in project-specific grant support to assist with**:

- Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) outreach and broadband adoption;
- Digital skill building, online navigation, and use;
- Community technology centers; and
- Broadband access expansion feasibility studies.

DOE Renew America's Nonprofits Grant

Funding

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) announced a first-of-its-kind investment to fund energy-efficiency improvements in the nonprofit sector. The Renew America's Nonprofits program will reduce carbon emissions, improve health and safety, and lower utilities costs at buildings owned and operated by 501(c)(3) nonprofits, allowing critical funds to be redirected to mission-focused work. Applications are due by August 5 at 5:00 PM.

CEJA NOFO Release

Funding

The Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity released the Notices of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) for the following CEJA programs:

- The <u>Clean Jobs Workforce Network Program</u> creates 13 regional Clean Jobs Workforce Hubs throughout the state to provide clean energy and related workforce and training opportunities to participants. **Applications** are due by September 1 at 5:00 PM
- The <u>Energy Transition Navigators Program</u> will provide grants to community-based providers to serve as Energy Transition Navigator Teams to recruit eligible individuals to participate in the Clean Jobs Workforce Network Program and the Illinois Climate Works Preapprenticeship Program. **Applications are due by August 15 at 5:00** PM
