 DCEO announced the release of a <u>Notice of Funding Opportunity</u> (NOFO) for the Community Solar Sovereignty Grant Program. This program will provide grants to organizations to plan, develop, and execute community solar projects throughout Illinois. The program provides upfront capital to support the development of community solar projects and provides seed capital and pre-development funding to support community ownership of renewable energy projects. Applicant teams that meet program eligibility requirements are invited to submit an application for funding by July 1, 2024 at 5:00 PM. The Illinois Works Bid Credit Program is designed for contractors working on or interested in working on State of Illinois-funded capital projects. 
