Ohio advocates advance skills-based SNAP E&T

Advocates in Ohio who have been pushing for the expansion of a skills-based SNAP E&T program are cheering an important step taken by the state legislature this session. Workforce advocates' recommendations are reflected in a new law which convenes a planning committee made up of community colleges, local workforce development boards, nonprofit organizations, and training organizations charged with expanding a skills-based SNAP E&T model in the state.
