One such conversation is NSC's continuing dialogue on the future of work and what it means for skills policy. This time we'll be delving into *There's More than One Future of Work: Uneven Prospects for Different Workers*. Research indicates the majority of job losses from automation will be borne by workers earning less than \$20 an hour with a high school degree or less; many of these will be workers of color. Mid- and late-career workers with less developed digital skills than their younger counterparts are likewise vulnerable, as are a range of other experienced people at workplaces that are unwilling or unable to continually invest in their re-skilling. How should public policy respond to the Future of Work impacts felt by these different groups of working Americans?
