HOW TO ENROLL

1 Attend an Information Session
Complete the assessment form to register.

2 Complete a Program Survey
Once submitted, an advisor will contact you.

3 Complete Application Packet
Submit the following documents and application components:

- Driver's license
- Birth Certificate, US Passport, or Resident Card
- Social security card
- High school diploma, transcripts, GED, or HiSET
- Proof of employment
- Application and career assesment

4 Complete 2 Scored Interviews
Average score is used to determine program fit.



THE CURRICULUM

- Work based/job site learning
- Construction math
- Test preparation classes
- Soft skills, including harassment prevention
- Additional certifications may include:
 - Fall protection
 - Flagger
 - Rigging and scaffold hazard awareness
